Overview of the programme and main features of the conference



The programme for ESCAIDE 2022 was packed with 5 plenaries, 9 Fireside sessions, 13 Poster tours, side events and networking opportunities. ESCAIDE 2022 offered more than 40 sessions, with more than 200 speakers and moderators. ESCAIDE 2022 presentations and scientific posters remain accessible for registered participants to view or review for three months, until end of February 2022.

Plenary sessions at ESCAIDE provide an opportunity to discuss public health challenges and scientific advances, bring together experts in cross-cutting fields to enable evidence from infectious disease research and epidemiology to be translated into improvements in public health. The content of the plenaries is proposed by the ESCAIDE Scientific Committee (10 cross-field members), who invite high level speakers to deliver inspiring presentations and address questions from the audience. There were five plenary sessions at ESCAIDE 2022, developed and chaired by the ESCAIDE Scientific Committee.

Abstracts are submitted to ESCAIDE and reviewed by a group of reviewers and the Scientific Committee. Those selected represent the latest in cutting-edge research from a broad spectrum of fields including infectious disease epidemiology, microbiology, surveillance, implementation science, modelling, preparedness and more. Abstracts are either presented as oral presentations (Fireside sessions) or as posters (Poster tours and online-only posters). In the programme, there were moderated fireside sessions and poster tours, in which presenters have the opportunity to delve deeper into their research and take questions from the audience.











ESCAIDE 2022 received 527 abstract submissions. 54 were accepted for oral presentation, 76 were presented in poster tours, and 52 were exhibited as online-only posters. The acceptance rate was 36%, which is lower than previous years (48% in 2021 and 2020, and 46% in 2019). The lower acceptance rate was due to limited programme capacity of the hybrid event, with only two parallel sessions for firesides and a need to reduce the poster terminals for poster tours.







ESCAIDE side-events aim to seed discussion on topics that were particularly relevant during the year, or to show case relevant work done in a certain field. They can take several formats (presentations, trainings, workshops, symposia, debates, etc.) and are organised by third parties, who are given latitude to self-organise and are free to experiment with form and content.

In-person registrations over 3-days

ESCAIDE 2022 received a total of 3031 registrations for in-person and online participation. This was comparable to the overall registration numbers in last year's online edition of the conference.

2402 registrations were received for participants wishing to attend only online, whereas a total of 629 registrations were received for inperson, with many participants registering for different conference days.



ESCAIDE 2022 registered participants indicated they were from 29 countries inside EU/EEA (2042) and from 94 countries outside EU/EEA (989).

Similarly to last year, when ESCAIDE went online for the second time, this is again an indication that the hybrid format with the option for online participation has created more opportunities for attendance for participants who might not attend in normal circumstances due to costs, travel, etc.


Participants



Even though 3031 participants registered for ESCAIDE 2022, not all of them attended the conference every day.

During the conference days, the number of in-person and online participants varied from 2595 on Day 1, 2193 on Day 2, and 1973 on Day 3.

EU/EEA representation



Participants registered either online or inperson from all 27 countries in the EU, along with Norway and Iceland.

Represented by the highest number of total participants were Germany (229), Romania (200), and the Netherlands (172).

There were 223 ECDC employees in total registered at the conference.

Outside EU/EEA representation



From outside Europe the countries with the biggest total representation were the United Kingdom (333), Canada (59) and India (49).

There are 75 countries from which less than 10 participants registered (total online and inperson) to ESCAIDE, not represented in this graphic.



Participants were asked to chose which field(s) of best described their expertise.


Almost half of the total registered participants (1320) indicated epidemiology as a field of expertise, and the communication and health promotion field was chosen by 1099 participants, followed by public health sciences (1098), respiratory diseases (954), and surveillance fields.

180 participants indicated 'Other' fields of expertise and specified them in a free text box.



Usage and engagement from 23-25 November

2427 active users during the conference days



From the total of 3031 registered participants, 2427 logged in during the conference days and engaged in the platform by viewing sessions, adding new contacts, bookmarking info-stands or registering to sessions.

It seems that 604 users registered to ESCAIDE 2022 but did not log in to the app during the conference days. Part of these participants could possibly have attended in-person without downloading the app.

Web App ① 78.3% ⋅2.325 users





The majority of participants (2325) accessed ESCAIDE online via the Swapcard Web App (78.3%). The mobile App had an average usage of 22.7%, where 11.7% accessed via a iOS device and 10% via Android.



The platform feature most used by participants was the "Programme" page. This is not surprising as all the content could be accessed via that page.




In general terms, ESCAIDE online created opportunities to establish connections and network. Across the conference, 2729 messages, comments and questions were sent on the mobile and web app (hosted by *Swapcard*), in a total of 443 discussions. The amount of comments, questions and discussions made in the chat boxes for sessions demonstrate active participation of the viewers. This number does not include the additional comments made in sessions held on MS Teams.

Plenary sessions ONLINE views




Charts in this section represent the online viewers. Viewers were counted as "unique viewers", which means that even if they watch more than once, that person counts as one unique viewer. Measuring "unique viewers" gives a clearer picture of the audience size.

Plenary sessions took place in hybrid format: they could be viewed either through the web and mobile app, or attended inperson.

The in-person attendance was 490 participants on Day 1, 483 participants per on Day 2 and 443 participants on Day 3.


The sessions in the morning (Plenaries A, C and E) had more online viewers than the sessions in the afternoon (B and D).





Poster tours ONLINE views






Poster tours ONLINE views


Number of unique viewers 10 most viewed posters

Exhibitors had the opportunity to show case their work onsite, in the info-stand area, and online.


This chart represents the total of online visitors. We do not have an estimation for in-person visitors of each info-stand, as that is tracked by the info-stand owners.

5. Overall, how satisfied are you with ESCAIDE 2022?




Two email invitations and a notification to complete the survey reached out to 3031 registered participants and 753 completed the survey, from 25 November until 7 December.

The response rate was 25% percent, higher than 2021 (18%).

The results of the feedback survey were overwhelmingly positive. 94% of respondents indicated they were 'extremely' or 'very much' satisfied with the event.


6. To what extent do you agree with the following statements about ESCAIDE 2022?


7. To what extent are you satisfied with the following organisational aspects of ESCAIDE 2022?


7.1. To what extent are you satisfied with the following format aspects of ESCAIDE 2022?


8. How would you best describe the following Plenary Sessions at ESCAIDE 2022?


9. How would you best describe the abstract-led events at ESCAIDE 2022?






10. How would you best describe the following side-events at ESCAIDE 2022?




11. To what extent do you agree with the following statements about the ESCAIDE online platform.

The respondents were invited to add anything they liked or disliked about the conference and identify areas for improvement free text questions. Additionally, those who had an active role at ESCAIDE (e.g. reviewers, presenters, moderators, etc.) were asked to comment on their experience. In total, 544 comments were received.

The responses were categorised according to which aspect of the conference they referred to, grouped by similar comments and summarised with verbal qualifiers according to frequency. For this exercise, 811 statements were categorised. In the next pages, we highlight comments that show the general perceptions of attendees, and include some comments made by a few respondents that expressed certain areas of interest.



Satisfaction	There were overwhelmingly positive results. 94% respondents were 'extremely' or 'very much' satisfied with the conference. The overall results of the survey showed that the respondents were highly satisfied with all aspects indicated.
Topics, content and networking	A very large majority of respondents 'extremely' or 'very much' agreed that ESCAIDE topics were relevant to their work (89%), that the programme and speakers were of high quality (95%), that the event fulfilled their educational goals and expectations (83%), that what they learned would be implemented in their practice (66%), that the content was well supported by scientific evidence (92%), that ESCAIDE created opportunities to establish meaningful connections and network (77%) and that the programme was free of commercial and other biases (94%).
Format aspects	There were very positive results overall, over 80% of respondents were either 'extremely' or 'very much' satisfied with most of the format aspects of the conference, such as the time allocated to Q&A, the role of the Master of Ceremonies and the usage of polls. A slightly lowest satisfaction rating was with only being able to ask questions online, where about 75% of respondents were 'extremely' or 'very much' satisfied, and 25% of respondents were only either 'somewhat' or 'not much' satisfied with this aspect of the conference.
Organisational aspects	Immensely positive results overall, indicating a high satisfaction, where respondents 'extremely' or 'very much' agreed with the organisational aspects of the conference, in particular the fact that no registration fees were collected (97%), the implementation of the hybrid event (93%) and the organisation/organisers (97%). The venue and the catering scored slightly lower than the other criteria, but were still positively assessed with 'extremely' or 'very much' satisfaction by about 80% of the respondents. The time of year of the conference in Autumn-Winter and the location of the hosting city being Stockholm scored lower with 77% and 67% of the respondents being 'extremely' or 'very much satisfied with these aspects, respectively.

Conclusions (Overall)

The respondents were asked about their agreement with a set of statements related with the conference. They could either agree or disagree with the statements by choosing 'extremely', 'very much', 'somewhat', 'not much' or 'not at all'. A neutral option 'I don't know' was also offered.

Web and mobile app

The web and mobile app was generally well received by respondents. Most participants 'extremely' or 'very much' agreed that the app facilitates access to conference information (85%), that it was user friendly (84%) and that it should continue to be used in future editions of the conference (75%). There was less agreement on their preference for asking questions only through the app and on the networking opportunities offered by the app, where 60 were 'extremely' or 'very much' satisfied with this aspect but about 32% responded that they were only 'somewhat' or 'not much' satisfied with this aspect. About 8-9% of the respondents indicated that they did not know how to assess this aspect, possibly because they have not used the app.

ESCAIDE 2023

When asked about their plans to attend ESCAIDE in 2023, 73% of respondents said they would 'extremely' or 'very much' prefer to attend in-person. 44% responded that they would consider to participate only online. A large majority (82%) indicated they would like ESCAIDE 2023 to be a hybrid event again.

Conclusions (Sessions)

To assess the quality of the sessions, participants could choose one of five aspects to describe different events at ESCAIDE: 'improved my knowledge', 'useful for my work', 'not relevant', 'didn't like', or 'didn't attend'.

The main quality the participants indicated was 'improved my knowledge' (in particular for Plenaries B and E), followed by 'useful for my work' (slightly higher for Plenaries A and C).

Side-events	There were very positive results overall. Most respondents rated the side-events highly in terms of improving their knowledge and being useful for their work. Only 3-10% of respondents either disliked these sessions or did not find them relevant to their work.

Conclusions (Open text comments)

The respondents were invited to add anything they liked or disliked about the conference and identify areas for improvement in free text questions. **Overall** A very large number of respondents appreciated the hybrid format of the conference, providing the possibility to attend feedback both in-person and online. The vast majority of attendees were extremely satisfied with the content of the event in terms of topics and content. Several comments described the topics as relevant, interesting, informative, interdisciplinary and were very pleased by the broad variety of topics included. Several people were very appreciative of the availability of recordings during and after the conference. The most debated issue concerned the format of questions posed by the participants: while online attendees were very appreciative of the possibility to ask questions via the app, several in-person attendees were not satisfied with it. Overall, the positive comments significantly exceeded the negative ones, and a lot of attendees showed interest in joining future editions of ESCAIDE. **Sessions** Plenary sessions were the most appreciated by the survey respondents, in particular in terms of speakers, which were described as engaging and passionate. Attendees positively commented also on the format in terms of time allocation and number of speakers per session. With respect to the content of the sessions, the majority of comments were positive, but the the amount of time dedicated to COVID-19 has divided respondents: several people reported an excessive focus on it, but several others asked to dedicate more attention to the topic in the next edition. The vast majority of survey respondents praised the programme topics and content. Many respondents were also **Programme** positively surprised by the informal and friendly atmosphere of the entire event. The main concerns related to the and content format of poster tours, that a few participants found non-intuitive to attend. The online-only posters were not received by some commenters due to the low level of interaction and attention by the audience. Venue and The venue and the catering served were appreciated by many respondents. The prevalent technical problem reported was Wi-Fi connection, that in some areas of the venue wasn't working well. Besides that, were reported the insufficient catering

number of headsets in some poster tours and some side sessions rooms' at full capacity.

Conclusions

ESCAIDE 2022 hybrid edition was able to reproduce the main elements of the conference to both online and in-person audiences.

The conference received 3031 registrations, representing 123 countries. The high number of participants and broader country representations clearly indicates that the online format has created oportunities for attendance for participants who might not attend in normal circumstances due to costs, travel, etc. We note however that attendance was still low from certain countries historically underrepresented at ESCAIDE and on the European public health stage, despite the online format being offered.

Notwithstanding the high number of registered participants, the number of active users on the platform varied every day, with a maximum number on the first day of the conference (2595) and minum on the last day (1973).

ESCAIDE 2022 required a thorough planning, preparing, and practicing to ensure that everything run as smoothly as possible from a technical perspective and in facilitating discussions and interactions. We built on learnings from 2021 to further streamline the hybrid experience and this will be valuable for future editions of ESCAIDE where this aspect will form an important part of the conference.

In general terms, the first ESCAIDE hybrid edition created opportunities to establish connections and network. The amount of comments, questions and discussions left in the chat boxes for sessions demonstrates active participation of the viewers.

The key results from the feedback survey conducted after the conference indicated a overwhelmingly positive satisfaction with the conference. However, it is important to acknowledge that the results in this report refer to the population who completed the survey, and we cannot conclude that the opinions expressed do reflect those of the majority of the participants.
