# Programme: Plenary sessions

Plenary sessions at ESCAIDE provide an opportunity to discuss public health challenges and scientific advances. They bring together experts from different fields, aiming to translate evidence from infectious disease research and epidemiology into improvements in public health. The content for these sessions is proposed by the ESCAIDE Scientific Committee, composed of 11 multidisciplinary members, who invite high-level speakers to deliver engaging presentations and answer audience questions. At ESCAIDE 2025, there were six plenary sessions, all developed and chaired by the Scientific Committee.



# Programme: Abstract presentations

ESCAIDE 2025 received 853 abstract submissions, of which 83 were selected for oral presentations and 145 for poster tours. The acceptance rate was 26.7%. For comparison, the acceptance rates were 34.3% in 2024, 26.2% in 2023 and 36% in 2022, with the lower acceptance rates in 2025 reflecting a surge in abstract submissions. This year the format of only in-person posters was maintained.



# Programme: Abstract presentations

Abstracts submitted to ESCAIDE 2025 were reviewed by 256 reviewers and the Scientific Committee. The selected abstracts highlight the latest research across a broad range of fields, including infectious disease epidemiology, microbiology, surveillance, implementation science, mathematical modelling, and preparedness. These abstracts were presented in two key formats: interactive oral presentations during Fireside sessions or visual displays in Poster tours, each followed by Q&A sessions with the moderators and audience. While 145 abstracts were accepted as poster presentations and 83 as oral presentations, only 133 and 82 were presented, respectively, due to last-minute retractions and cancellations.

# Programme: Other events

# Registrations and attendance



ESCAIDE 2025 received 4 171 registrations, with 3 405 signing up for online attendance and 766 for in-person participation. Of these, 75 registered participants did not show up to attend in person, and 1 188 did not participate online. In total, we had 2 908 active participants: 2 217 joined online, and 691 attended in person. We considered online attendees active if they accessed the platform, viewed sessions, added contacts, or participated in other activities during the event.

Due to high demand, in-person registrations closed in July after reaching full capacity in less than 48 hours. This demand for in-person attendance, as well as the waiting list of 300+ people, reflects a continuing increase in the popularity of the conference and an appreciation for the opportunities it offers. Registrations for online attendance remained open until the end of the conference.

# Attendance

## Unique in-person and online attendees



At ESCAIDE 2025, 691 participants attended in person, while 2 217 joined exclusively online. Daily attendance varied, with ~600–700 people on-site and 1 350–1 750 online each day.

During the conference, more than 2 471 participants used the online platform, as this figure does not include in-person attendees who also accessed it. Also, these numbers only cover activity during the conference days. Many participants, as in past years, log in after the event to watch videos on demand, which remain available until end of March 2026. This shows that engagement with the platform keeps growing even after the conference ends.



ESCAIDE 2025 registered participants indicated they were from 30 countries inside EU/EEA and from 96 countries outside EU/EEA.

126 countries were represented at ESCAIDE 2025, an increase from 2024, when 122 countries were represented. The hybrid format has continued to support broader participation. It allowed individuals to join who might otherwise have been unable to attend due to costs, travel constraints, or other barriers.

# EU/EEA country representation




Participants registered either online or in person from all 27 EU countries, as well as Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway.

Sweden, Germany, and the Netherlands had the highest number of in-person participants with 82, 72, and 59, respectively.

Poland, which hosted the event, had 177 attendees in person and online.


Romania and Portugal showed a strong preference for online attendance, likely influenced by factors such as distance, travel costs, or other barriers.

# Registered participants by field of expertise



Participants selected fields that best matched their expertise, with the option to select multiple categories. In total, amongst online and onsite participants, 1 522 chose epidemiology, 1 337 selected surveillance, 834 identified with vaccine-preventable diseases, 726 with generic public health sciences, and 647 with preparedness.

57 participants also indicated 'Other' fields of expertise and specified them in a free text box.

Active users on the web and mobile app




Out of the 4 171 participants registered for the conference, 2 908 actively engaged with the platform during the event. This included logging in to view sessions, add contacts, bookmark posters and info-stands, or register for specific sessions.

It appears that 1 263 participants registered for ESCAIDE 2025 but did not log in to the app during the conference. Some of these may have attended in person without using the app, while others were likely digital no-shows.





Overall, ESCAIDE's online platform provided valuable opportunities for networking and connection. Throughout the conference, participants sent 2 030 messages, comments and questions via the mobile and web app. The volume of activity in session chat boxes, including comments, questions, and discussions, highlights the active engagement of viewers.



Charts in this section represent the online viewers for plenary sessions. Viewers were counted as “unique viewers”, which means that even if they watch more than once, that person counts as one unique viewer. Measuring “unique viewers” gives a clearer picture of the audience size.

Plenary sessions took place in hybrid format: they could be viewed either through the web and mobile apps or attended in person.

The sessions in the morning (Plenaries A, C and E) had more online viewers than the sessions in the afternoon (B, D and F).


# Plenary sessions audience polls






Number of unique viewers




# Feedback survey

## 1. How did you attend ESCAIDE 2025?

Two email invitations and a notification to complete the survey were sent to all registered participants, of which 1 132 completed the survey, from 21 November until 7 December.


The response rate was 38.9%, whereas in ESCAIDE 2024 was 43.6% and ESCAIDE 2023, 27%.



70.1% of respondents attended ESCAIDE online only, while 24.0% participated in person only and 5.6% in-person and online.

## 2. Where do you currently work?

30.8% of respondents were from outside the EU/EEA, while 69.2% were from EU/EEA countries. This matches the overall response rates from previous years: for ESCAIDE 2024 30.8% of respondents were from outside the EU/EEA, while 69.2% were from EU/EEA countries.




## 5.1. Overall, how satisfied are you with ESCAIDE 2025?

The feedback survey results were overwhelmingly positive. A total of 95.7% of respondents reported being either 'extremely' (487 responses) or 'very much' (596 responses) satisfied with the event. This satisfaction did not vary significantly whether participants had attended ESCAIDE for the first time, or several times already.

The 'Somewhat', 'Not much', and 'Not at all' categories had very few responses, with only 44, 1, and 1 respectively, showing that dissatisfaction was minimal.


The strong majority of positive feedback highlights the conference's success in delivering a fulfilling experience for both online and onsite audiences.

### Satisfaction by type of attendance








## 8. How would you best describe the following Plenary Sessions at ESCAIDE 2025? (select all that apply)









# Feedback survey results

## Conclusions (Overall)

Respondents were asked about their agreement with a set of statements related with the conference. The satisfaction was evaluated by selecting 'extremely', 'very much', 'somewhat', 'not much' or 'not at all'. The quality of the conference organisation and programme was evaluated according to 'very good' 'good', 'fair', and 'poor' and the topics, content, networking, and organisational aspects with 'very much', 'somewhat', 'not much', and 'not at all'.

<b>Satisfaction</b>	There were positive results: 95.7% of respondents were 'extremely' or 'very much' satisfied with the conference. The overall results of the survey showed that the respondents were highly satisfied with all aspects indicated.
<b>Quality</b>	97.8% of respondents considered that the quality of the conference programme and sessions was 'very good' or 'good' and 98.2% evaluated the quality of the organisation and logistical aspects as 'very good' or 'good'.
<b>Topics, content and networking</b>	A very large majority of respondents 'very much' or 'somewhat' agreed that ESCAIDE topics were relevant to their work (99.1%), that the overall calibre of speakers was good (98.4%), that the event fulfilled their educational goals (96.5%), that what they learned would be implemented in their practice (92.2%), that the information presented was supported by a valid scientific evidence base (99.1%), that ESCAIDE created opportunities to establish meaningful connections and network (87.5%), that the session formats were suitable (98.4%), and that the programme was free of commercial and other biases (96.1%).
<b>Organisational aspects</b>	There were very positive results overall, high number of respondents were either 'very much' or 'somewhat' satisfied with most of the organisational aspects of the conference, such as the role of the Master of Ceremonies (88.9%), the fact that no registration fees were collected (92.8%), the sustainability efforts (77.9%), and the time of the year (80.1%). The venue, catering and the hosting city scored slightly lower than the other criteria (70.1%, 70.5%, and 70.7%, respectively).
<b>Platform</b>	The online platform (Swapcard) was rated positively by the respondents with 'very much' or 'somewhat' in terms of access to conference information (96.2%), ease of use (95.1%), platform reliability (93.1%), questions functionality (91.1%), opportunities for interaction between onsite and online participants (90.3%), and the quality of live-streamed sessions (87.4%). The networking features in the platform scored slightly lower, with 83.7% of respondents.

# Feedback survey results

## Conclusions (Overall)

To assess the quality of the sessions, participants could select various aspects to best describe different events at ESCAIDE: 'improved my knowledge', 'useful for my work', 'introduced new ideas', 'not relevant', 'didn't like', or 'didn't attend'.

<b>Plenary sessions</b>	There were positive results overall. Most respondents rated the plenary sessions highly in terms of improving their knowledge and being useful for their work. The main quality the participants indicated was 'improved my knowledge' (in particular for Plenaries A and C), followed by 'useful for my work' (especially for Plenary C and E), and 'introduced new ideas' (especially in Plenary A). Only 1.3% of respondents disliked one of the plenaries or did not find them relevant to their work.
<b>Abstract sessions</b>	There were very positive results overall. Most respondents rated the abstract-led sessions highly in terms of improving their knowledge and being useful for their work. Only 0.8% of respondents either disliked these sessions or did not find them relevant to their work.
<b>Side-events</b>	There were very positive results overall, most respondents rated the side-events highly in terms of improving their knowledge and being useful for their work. Only 1.0% of respondents either disliked these sessions or did not find them relevant to their work.

# Feedback survey results

## Conclusions (Overall)

The respondents were asked about their agreement with a set of statements related with the conference.

<b>Communication</b>	97.6% respondents expressed that they felt 'very much' or 'somewhat' well informed about the event in a timely way. The favourite ways to receive the content were through the newsletter sent by email, the ESCAIDE website and the web and mobile app hosted by <i>Swapcard</i> .
<b>ESCAIDE 2026</b>	When asked about their plans to attend ESCAIDE in 2025, 36.2% of respondents said they were 'not sure' how they will attend, but they 'like having the choice between in-person and online'. 31.3% responded that they plan to attend in person and 31.3% plan to participate only online. Only 1.2% of respondents indicated they are not planning to attend ESCAIDE 2025.
<b>Overall results</b>	The majority of respondents expressed extreme satisfaction with the event's topics and content, finding the sessions relevant and useful. The programme was particularly praised for quality and variety, along with the appreciated policy of free attendance. Additionally, the web and mobile app, and the availability of session recordings were highly valued for its convenience. Overall, positive feedback outweighed any negative responses, with many attendees expressing willingness to participate in ESCAIDE 2026. Constructive feedback and suggestions for improvement were taken note of, and will be considered for implementation in future editions of the conference.

# Conclusions

# Conclusions

ESCAIDE 2025 successfully brought people together through its hybrid format, delivering the conference experience to a global audience from 126 countries. With 2 908 active participants, three quarters of which attended the conference remotely, the online option once again proved its value in overcoming barriers like cost and travel.

The 3-day programme covered a wide range of topics related to infectious disease prevention and control, bringing together over 300 speakers and moderators spread across 64 sessions, including plenary sessions, fireside sessions, poster tours and side events.

Feedback from the post-conference survey was highly positive, with 95.7% of respondents expressing satisfaction with the event and highlighting the quality and variety of the programme and sessions, and the overall organisation. A few areas for improvement were also identified, including the need for more onsite networking opportunities and a less packed programme, as some participants suggested avoiding side sessions during the lunch break. As the previous year, the conference only offered onsite poster presentations, and some online attendees mentioned that they would appreciate the possibility of accessing these presentations as well.

The use of *Swapcard* as the conference online platform was generally well-received for its ease of use, access to the conference information, and for allowing hybrid interactions between speakers and participants, but a few technical features can still be fine-tuned to improve the user experience. As previous years, we saw strong engagement throughout the event, especially in the session chats, where participants contributed lively and thoughtful discussions.

Organising ESCAIDE is a team effort based on collaboration. Behind the scenes, we built on past learnings, planned carefully, and ensured smooth technical execution to deliver a seamless experience for both online and onsite audiences.

ESCAIDE continues to be a unique opportunity for public health professionals to share knowledge, connect with peers, and build lasting collaborations. As we continue to grow and evolve, we remain committed to providing a highly-valued conference for exchange, networking and dissemination of the work of the public health community, while keeping these core values at the heart of the conference.
