### **ESCAIDE 2021: EVALUATION REPORT** *14 December 2021*





### Summary

3041	<b>Registrations</b> , representing 123 countries. There was a six-fold increase in overall registration numbers in comparison to in-person editions.
+2700	<b>Comments, questions and messages</b> exchanged during the conference. 2448 were sent on <i>Swapcard</i> and 310 in the MS Teams meetings where a few sessions took place (Poster tours, BarCamp and Career Compass).
2427	Active participants logging into the conference platform to view sessions, add new contacts, bookmark info-stands, etc., during the conference days.
316	<b>Abstracts submitted:</b> From the 165 accepted, 53 were presented as oral communications and 112 as a poster. The acceptance rate was 48%, which is similar to previous years.

# ESCAIDE 2021

Overview of programme and main features of the conference




The programme for ESCAIDE 2021 is made up of plenaries, abstract-led sessions and side-events. ESCAIDE 2021 offered more than 100 sessions, with a more than 200 speakers and moderators. There were about 48 hours of content over the four days of conference. ESCAIDE 2021 presentations and scientific posters remain accessible for registered participants to view or review for three months, until end of December 2021.


Plenaries provide an opportunity to discuss public health challenges and scientific advances, bring together experts in crosscutting fields to enable evidence from infectious disease research and epidemiology to be translated into improvements in public health. The content of plenaries is proposed by the ESCAIDE Scientific Committee (10 cross-field members), who invite high level speakers to deliver inspiring presentations and address questions from the audience. There are four plenary sessions at ESCAIDE 2021, chaired by the ESCAIDE Scientific Committee. The format of each varies from panel discussions, interviews and debates.







Abstracts are submitted to ESCAIDE and reviewed by a group of reviewers and the Scientific Committee. Those selected represent the latest in cutting-edge research from a broad spectrum of fields including infectious disease epidemiology, microbiology, surveillance, implementation science, modelling, preparedness and more. Abstracts are either presented as oral presentations (Abstract pitches) or as posters. In the programme, there were moderated fireside panels and poster tours, in which presenters have the opportunity to delve deeper into their research and take questions from the audience.







Alongside a packed scientific programme, many events were hosted at ESCAIDE this year. For the first time the European Antibiotic Awareness Day (EAAD) took place at ESCAIDE. *Eurosurveillance* celebrated its 25<sup>th</sup> with a seminar at ESCAIDE that included a reflection on the work of *Eurosurveillance* to date, and an in-depth discussion of the translation of virological and immunological observations, into research into practice.



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In the context of ESCAIDE, side-events aim to seed discussion on topics that were particularly relevant during the year, or to show case relevant work done in a certain field. They can take several formats (presentations, trainings, workshops, symposia, debates, etc.) and are organised by third parties, who are given latitude to self-organise and are free to experiment with form and content.



### Abstract submissions, review and selection




ESCAIDE 2021 received 316 abstract submissions. 53 were accepted for oral communications and 112 were presented as a poster. The acceptance rate was 48.5%, which is similar to previous years (48 in 2020 and 46% in 2019, 2018 and 2017).





### **Registered participants**



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ESCAIDE 2021 received 3041 registered participants. There was a two-fold increase in overall registration numbers in comparison to last year's online edition and a six-fold increase comparing to in-person editions.




ESCAIDE 2021 registered participants indicated they were from 29 countries inside EU/EEA (2076) and from 94 countries outside EU/EEA (965). Similarly to last year, when ESCAIDE went online for the first time, this is again an indication that the online format has created more opportunities for attendance for participants who might not attend in normal circumstances due to costs, travel, etc.





### Participants by field of expertise



Participants were asked to chose which field(s) of best describe their expertise. Almost half of the registered participants (1401) indicated epidemiology as a field of expertise, and the public health field was chosen by 1227 professionals, followed by health care (471) and microbiology (439) fields. 156 participants selected 'Other' and specified their job title in a free text box, which will require additional recategorisation.






Fireside sessions were held in parallel and could be viewed on the *Swapcard* platform.







**Attendance Poster Tours Day 1** 




### **Attendance Poster Tours Day 2**





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Two email invitations and a notification to complete the survey reached out to 3041 registered participants and 558 completed the survey, from 19 until 30 November.

The response rate was 18% percent, similar to 2020 (20%) and half of previous years (42% in 2019, 2018, 2017).

The results from the feedback survey indicated a high satisfaction with the event.

On a scale from 1 (Not at all satisfied) to 5 (Extremely satisfied), 93% of respondents indicated they were "very" or "extremely" satisfied with the event.

85% of respondents indicated they would "Very much" recommend ESCAIDE 2022 to others.





All written responses were categorised according to which aspect of the conference they referred to, grouped by similar comments and summarised with verbal qualifiers according to frequency. Here we have highlighted comments that show the general perceptions of attendees, and included some comments made by a few respondents that highlighted certain areas of interest.



When asked about their plans to attend ESCAIDE in 2022, 52% of respondents said they would prefer to attend in person.

On the last day of the conference, a poll was launched asking a similar question. 121 participants responded, with 44% indicating they would prefer to attend ESCAIDE 2022 in-person. Only 12% responded that they would prefer to participate only online and that result is quite different from the feedback given in the survey, where 40% said they would "Very much" prefer to attend online.



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## Conclusions



### Conclusions

ESCAIDE 2021 online reproduced the main elements of the in-person event: plenary sessions, oral and poster presentations, side events, info-stands.

The conference received 3041 registrations, representing 123 countries. There was an increase in overall registrations and attendance numbers in comparison to last year and previous in-person editions. The high number of participants and broader country representations clearly indicates that the online format has created oportunities for attendance for participants who might not attend in normal circumstances due to costs, travel, etc. We note however that attendance was still low from certain countries historically underrepresented at ESCAIDE and on the European public health stage, including Poland, despite the online format.

Notwithstanding the high number of registered participants, the number of active users on the platform varied every day, with a maximum number on the first day of the conference (2119) and minum on the last day (1654).

In general terms, ESCAIDE online created opportunities to establish connections and network. The amount of comments, questions and discussions left in the chat boxes for sessions demonstrates active participation of the viewers.

The key results from the feedback survey conducted after the conference indicated a high satisfaction with the event. However, it is important to acknowledge that the results in this report refer to the population who completed the survey, and we cannot conclude that the opinions expressed do reflect those of the majority of the participants.

ESCAIDE 2021 required a thorough planning, preparing, and practicing to ensure that everything run as smoothly as possible from a technical perspective and in facilitating discussions and interactions. We built on learnings from 2020 to further streamline the online experience and this will be valuable for future editions of ESCAIDE where an online aspect will form an important part of the conference.
